### Josh has the tools to take his **Next Steps**

Sixteen year old Army Cadet Josh lives in a Housing Choices property in Southern Tasmania, with his dad Julian. When a property became available after a period of housing insecurity, they jumped at the chance to secure one of the brandnew units. With a strong military history in the family, their unit tells the tale. Josh's dad Julian and grandfather Jack were both part of the Australian Army, and Josh can count 15 family members who served in World War One – including one who was at Gallipoli.

Josh is an amateur archaeologist and historian with a strong interest in all things military. In one of their many display cabinets you'll find spent shells, tools and medicine bottles found at the local foreshore, wartime photography and pieces of kit like the distinctive Australian Army slouch hat.

If you're lucky, Josh might even show you his gas mask – found online and in original condition! His most surprising find was a newspaper article about a relative on Nan's side.

"He lived up near Launceston, and he got arrested for going down the rails on a bicycle without a light!" said Josh, telling the story with a chuckle.

When he finishes school, Josh hopes to join the Australian Army as a Heavy Vehicle Mechanic or Infantryman in the Australian Army.

"I'd like to be in the infantry or a mechanic", explained Josh.

To get there, he's taking part in a course at his local college which focuses on restoring vehicles for students to use once they get their P's. At the moment they're working on a

classmates Hyundai, but he'll have the chance to take in his project, a 1990 AF Falcon, soon.

Housing Choices has supported Josh to take part in the course through the Next Steps Incentive by supplying essential tools. The positive effects go beyond the practical skills learnt.

"Joshua's health and wellbeing is at its best when he has structure and is kept busy and engaged. The college provides smaller classes, with oneon-one support. To enjoy his time as a student this is really important... It will keep him engaged in learning" said Josh's dad, Julian.

"I hope other families know about this program, so that they can get this support too", he continued.

The Next Steps Incentive is available to Housing Choices residents aged between 15 and 25 years, and assists with out-of-pocket training and education expenses like uniforms, equipment, textbooks, tutoring or extra learning activities.

The assistance of up to \$1,000 aims to assist young residents in taking the next step in their lives. This could be academic or building job skills to enter the work force.

If you're not sure how to go about applying, help is at hand! All residents are encouraged to receive guidance with their application by working with our Community Development Team. ### Maintenance Matters Fire Awareness



A fire in your home can be devastating, even fatal. Once a fire starts it can spread rapidly putting you and your loved ones at risk. While the dangers of fire are very real, there is a lot you can do to protect yourself, your family and your home.

 Check your smoke alarm/s are working and call the
 maintenance team

**maintenance team** on **1300 312 447** as soon as possible if it needs repair.



Look out for fire hazards in the home: remove rubbish, clutter and flammable items.

 Keep looking when cooking: check that heat sources are turned off before leaving home or going to sleep, never use water to extinguish an oil or grease fire, and always supervise children in the kitchen.



Stick it, don't flick it: do not smoke in bed. Smoking in bed is one of the leading causes of fire-related deaths.

 One metre from the heater: if drying clothes indoors, make sure each item is at least one metre from the heater.



- clothing that is on the balcony. Do not cover air-conditioning units with clothes or other materials.
  Do not use barbecues
- Do not use barbecues and heaters or any open flames on balconies near potentially combustible material.
- Do not store gas bottles on balconies.
  - Always keep fire doors clear, closed and unlocked at all times.
  - Keep hallways and balconies clear to avoid obstructing occupants needing to exit the building.
  - Familiarise yourself
     with your building evacuation procedures.



If a fire occurs in your home, **get out,** stay out and call Triple Zero (000).

Preparing for your **routine inspection** 



At Housing Choices, we conduct two main types of inspections – Routine Inspections and Property Condition Surveys (PCS). Each inspection serves a purpose, but what's the difference?

	Routine Inspection	Property Condition Survey					
How often?	Every six to twelve months	Every three years					
Why?	To check that your property is being looked after to an acceptable standard and discuss any maintenance, personal or tenancy issues.						
Who will be coming for the inspection?	Your Housing Officer.	A Maintenance Officer who you may not have met before.					
How to prepare?	<ul> <li>Complete a general clean and tidy of your home.</li> <li>Do your best to make sure all rooms are clearly visible.</li> <li>Think about any maintenance, personal or tenancy issues you'd like to raise with your Housing Officer.</li> <li>Do your best to make su all rooms are clearly visible.</li> <li>Think about any maintenance officer.</li> <li>Do your best to make su all rooms are clearly visible.</li> <li>Think about any maintenance officer.</li> </ul>						
How will you let me know?	We will let you know the day of your inspection and a time frame two weeks before.						
Do I need to be home?	We prefer you to be at home but understand this may not be possible.						
What do I do with my pets?	On the day, please make sure your pets are secure so our staff can access your property safely.
